Glipizide (Glucotrol)	<ul> <li>Always take with meals</li> <li>Your nurse will tell you when and how much to take, if you are prescribed Glipizide</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>⇒ Low blood sugar</li> <li>⇒ Diarrhea/nausea</li> <li>⇒ Dizziness/headache</li> </ul>
Actos (Pioglitazone)	<ul> <li>Always take with meals</li> <li>Your nurse will tell you when and how much to take, if you are prescribed Actos</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>⇒ Weight gain</li> <li>⇒ Headache</li> <li>⇒ Joint pain</li> </ul>
Metformin (Glucophage)	<ul> <li>Always take with meals</li> <li>Your nurse will tell you when and how much to take, if you are prescribed Metformin</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>⇒ Diarrhea</li> <li>⇒ Nausea/vomiting</li> <li>⇒ Headache</li> <li>⇒ Rash</li> </ul>
